A Message from the Principal, Ms. Nicola Barrett

I feel very proud and humbled, as I reflect upon the first term at Presentation Secondary School, Ballyphehane. As we approach Christmas, we endeavour to give you a small insight into some of the happenings in the school over the last term, which would not have been possible without the support of the students, staff, parents / guardians, board of management and the wider community.

It has been a very busy but very successful term. Excellent work has again been done in the academic field, firstly seen through the outstanding Leaving Cert and Junior Cert results. It is great to see our students Emma Daly and Ciara Elliot qualify for the Young Scientists competition in January, something only a select few get to achieve. And Mayar Khalawi to be selected for a once in a lifetime trip to China in April by UCC. Our very own Quercus scholarship in the memory of Mrs Katrina O'Flynn, RIP and donated by her family were awarded again this year. These awards were one of the highlights of a very successful College Awareness week which also included an 'on the couch chat' with Marty Morrissey, Rob Heffernan and past pupils.

Presentation Secondary School has always been, and continues to be, a school that leads the way in innovation, ensuring that the best possible opportunities are provided for our students and that they learn to give to others. 
tournament, they played 3 games at St. Vincent's Secondary School. Well done girls!


Climate Change Conference by Emily and Lily

6th Year Trip To 'Hamlet' by Amy O'Herlihy.


